

Objective: To seek a Rewarding experience as a National Park Service Volunteer.

- Assisted manager of Christ the King Catholic Church articles store 3- 7 hours weekly for four months by performing inventories, aiding customers in buying various items
- Received, cleaned, and priced multiple items of items no longer needed by previous owners for country store which is raising money to finance new playground for students
- Volunteered for Catholic Charity Organization (Knights of Columbus) at St. Josephs Church in Jacksonville, Florida assisting church members with ushering services, setting up/taking down Holiday decorations and donating own items (i.e. VCRs, furniture) to religious articles store customers

- Volunteered in on loading about 500 large cargo containers for a ship which was successfully completed in three days during September, 2000, resulting in the foreign deploying ship to leave port two days ahead of schedule
